<b>Quarterly Activities/ Project Description</b> The Auburn Boulevard Streetscape project is an existing project supported with annual CDBG entitlement funds. CDBG-R is intended to invest in transportation and/or other infrastructure projects that will provide a long-term economic benefit. CDBG-R specifically recommends grantees identify activities previously approved to receive funding from its regular 2009 CDBG allocation and consider whether activities could be accelerated by being funded with CDBG-R. The Auburn Boulevard project meets this requirement. In the first quarter of 2012, the Auburn Boulevard Streetscape Project (between Bell Street and Fulton Avenue) installed the curb and gutter section on the north side of Auburn Blvd, installed the median islands, finished the drainage system, installed the Blade Sign foundations and electrical conduit, began the construction of the median monument and lighting, and installed the concrete barrier and fence plates.
