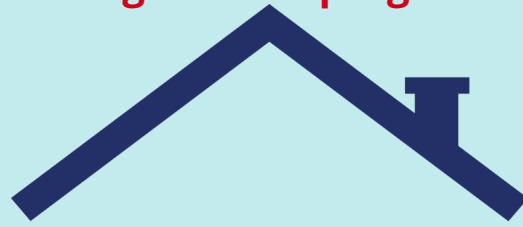

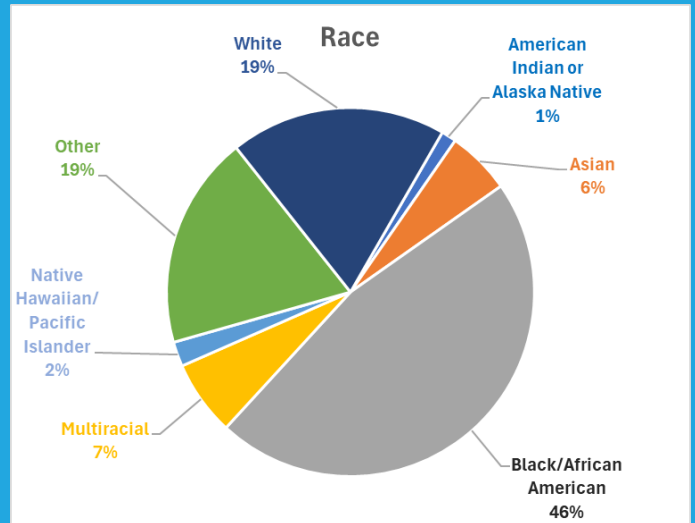

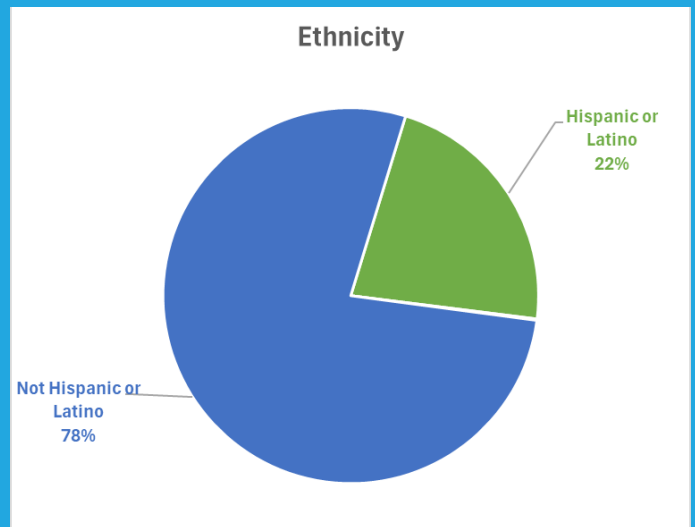

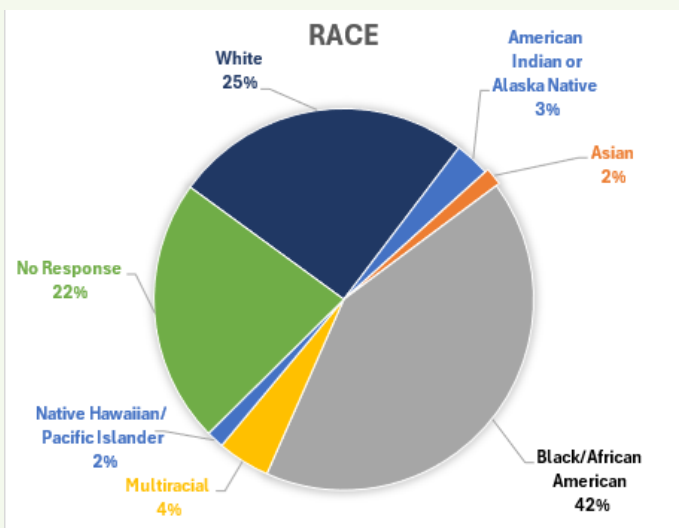

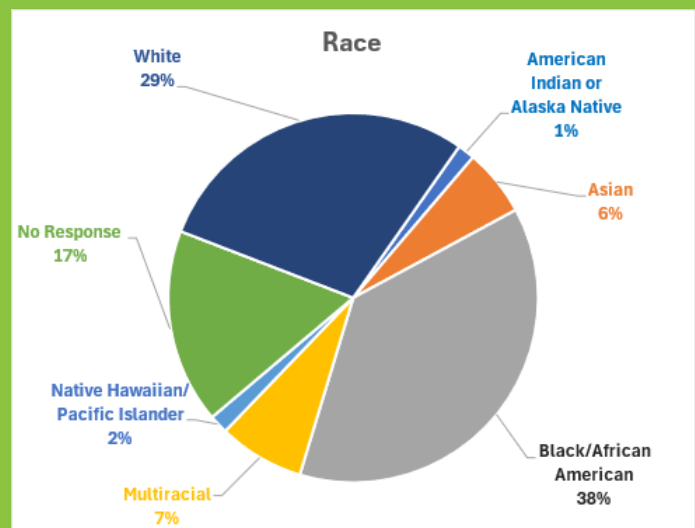


County Q4



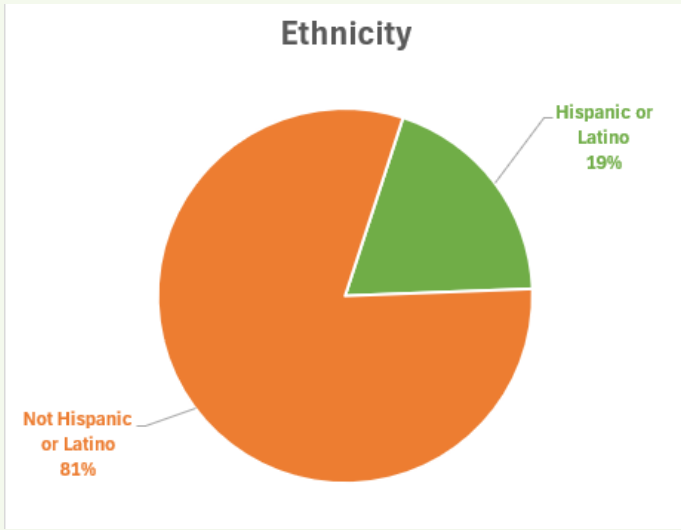

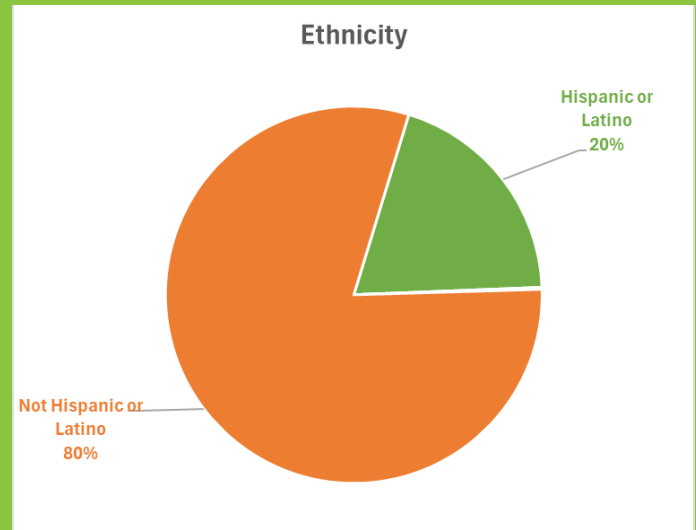

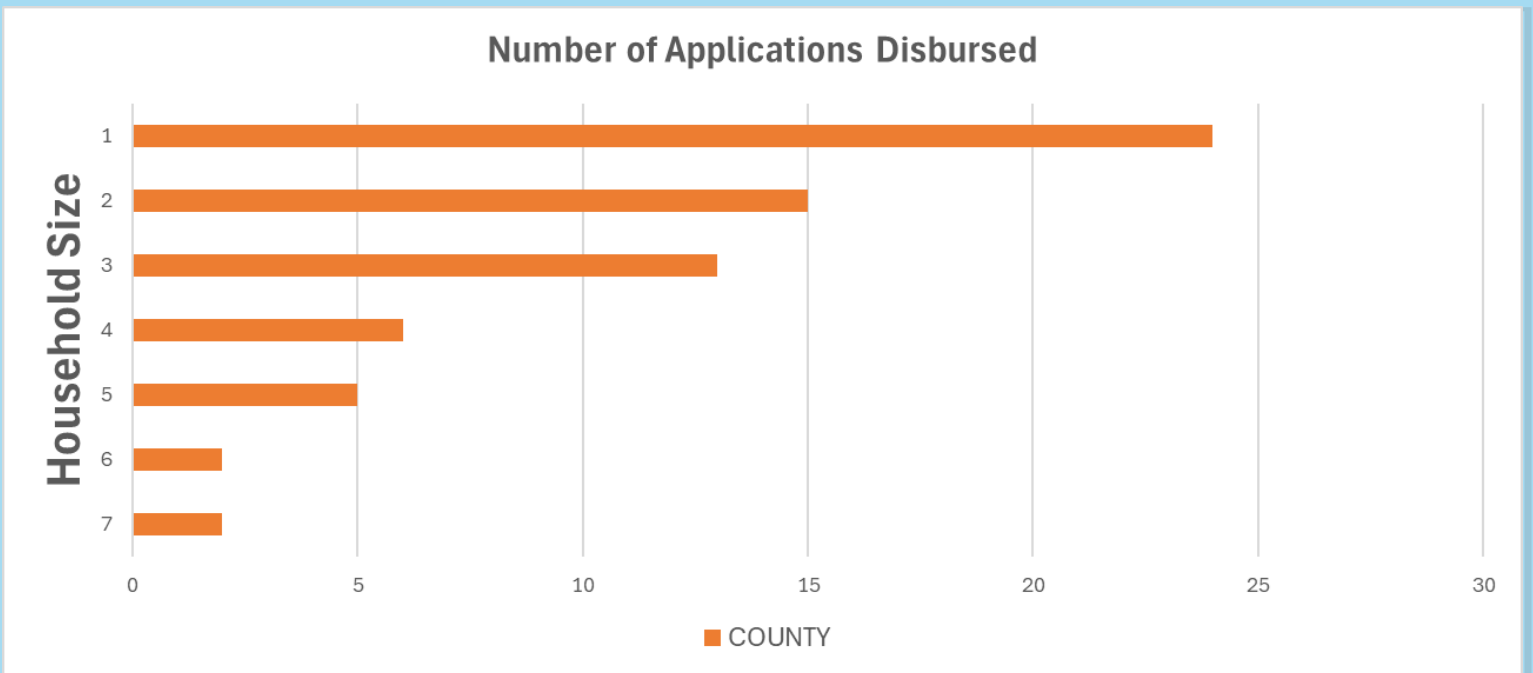

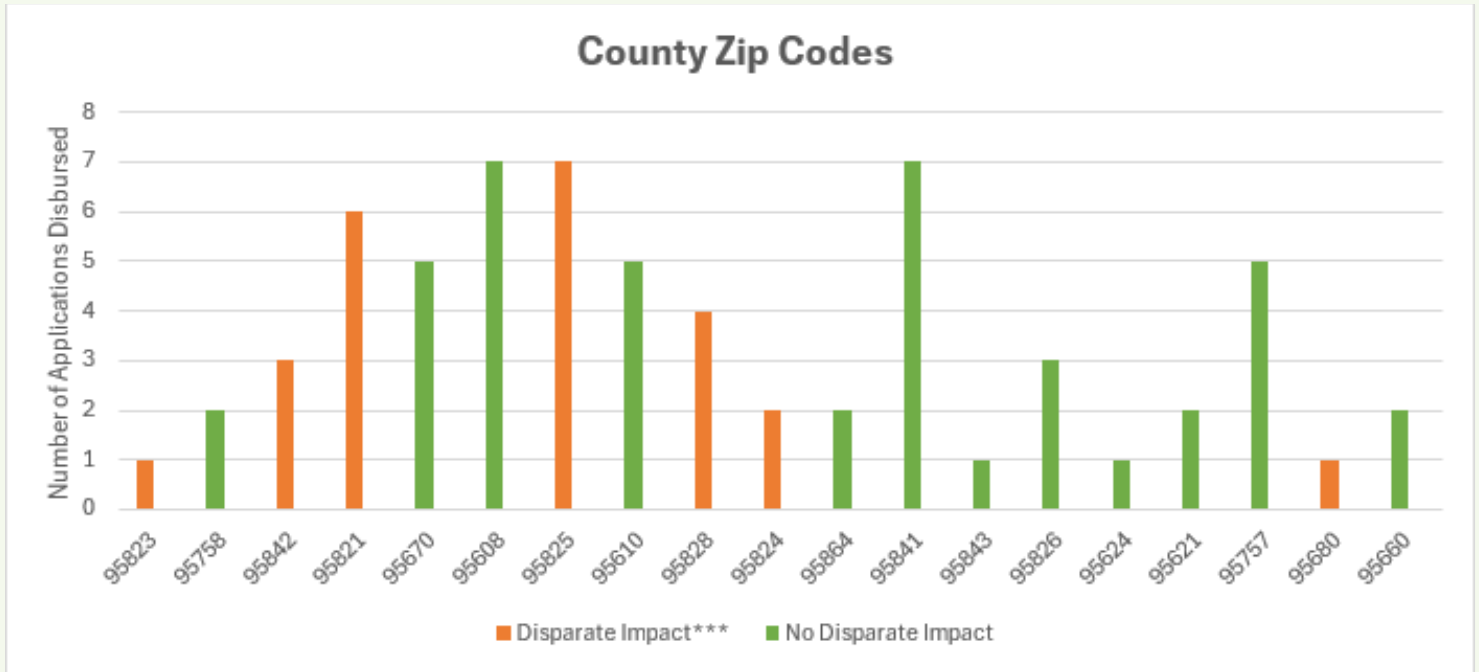


Q4 Disbursements By Household Size
